Using the **chart** below <u>cite examples</u> Do the Quebecois form a distinct ethnicity within the Canadian nationality or a second nation separate altogether from Anglo-Canadian?

**Ethnicity**: Social status, usually a minority group within a country. Have common cultural traits: religion, customs, origins.

Nation: a culturally distinctive group of people occupying a region and bound together by a sense of unity arising from shared ethnicity, beliefs, and customs. Nations desire territory. Allegiance would be to Quebec more than to Canada.

The distinction is critical, because if Quebecois is recognized as a separate nationality from Anglo-Canadian, the Quebec government would have a much stronger justification for breaking away from Canada to form an independent country.
